WHAT KIND OF EXTRACURRICULARS ARE VALUED?

- Enhances discussion
- Enables prompt thinking
- Sensitizes to different cultures
- Develops power of negotiation





VOLUNTEERING

- Demonstrates your passion for development work
- Reinforces your claim of interest in the development field

Leadership skills:

Developed from your practical experience



IMPORTANCE OF FIELD-LEVEL EXPERIENCE BEFORE APPLYING IN NATIONAL LEVEL

Better to gain some experience at the local level before joining international development organizations

WHY?

- Demonstrates the candidate is accustomed and familiar to the real life scenario
- International development organizations require you to have at least 3 years of prior experience



ENTRY LEVEL JOBS IN THE INTERNATIONAL DEVELOPMENT SECTOR

Professional 1 (P1) level of UN claims that no prior experience is required.

This is not entirely true. Why?

Because it is a highly competitive job.

How can you compete effectively?

- Fulfill your academic goals
- Have a career-oriented mindset during education
- Volunteer in development organizations
- Work at local level prior to applying



WHY IS VOLUNTEERING SO IMPORTANT?

Helps you understand whether you will truly sustain in the development field



Helps you gain an indepth idea about the field you want to work in

Start your entry-level job in UN as:

- United Nations Volunteers
- Junior Professional Officer
- Local-development work

Having extensive fieldlevel experience at local level



NECESSARY ACADEMIC PREREQUISITES

Better to have academic **background relevant** to the position you apply for

How to know what subject you want to study?

- Important to study in areas of development that are a priority now
- Then, analyzing which particular field(s) you are passionate towards in that area
- However, skills are transferable for which a candidate needs to have an open mindset about work
